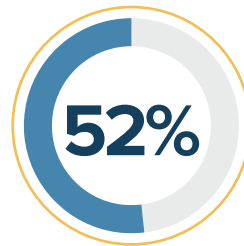
VIRTUAL LEARNING IS FAILING STUDENTS



Majority of parents say virtual learning had a **negative impact** on their child's academic performance.

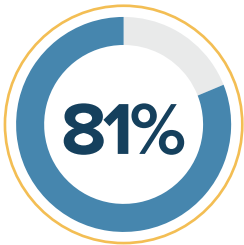


Most parents agree virtual learning had a **negative impact** on their child's mental health.

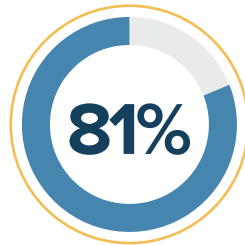


More than half of parents say they became **more involved** in their child's curriculum because of virtual learning.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT MATTERS

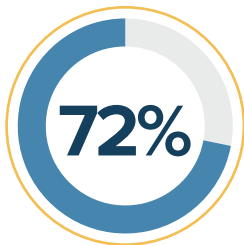


Americans are **concerned** with the quality of academic education today.

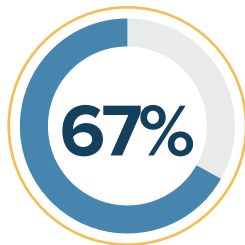


After learning about declining test scores and widening achievement gaps, Americans are **more concerned** with education quality.
